

OUR AIRPORT ROAD

Cairnbrogie Estate:

Horse riding ((Lee 0817484904) as well as lovely trails for hiking and mountain biking, including ebikes if you book from ELEVEN (+27 79 383 5578).

Dairy: Delight the kids with a real-life farm experience every Monday and Thursday afternoon from 3pm as they watch the cows and calves come in for feeding time.

Cairnbrogie Cafe serves top-quality coffee and a selection of eats. Open Fri, Sat, Sun & Public Holidays.

Fishing: Bring your rods and while away the day fishing for bass in the idyllic dam on the edge of the Cairnbrogie pine forest. Catch and release only.

Robberg Nature Reserve: about 10 minutes drive from us and absolutely spectacular. Worth a visit.

Archery Adventures: 3D Archery Adventure through forest and field. Old School Farm, 6600 Plettenberg Bay

Ice Dream Land: a pizza restaurant run by a family originally from Italy, it has great ambiance with relaxed outdoor seating, a big playground and much of what they use they make themselves including cheeses and ice creams, open until 4pm.













BUCKET LIST

- 1. Hike the trail along the spectacular coastline to the seal colony at Robberg National Park and Beach, the entrance is just 10 minutes from Plettenvale Wines.
- 2. Saturday morning Park Run followed by breakfast and shopping at the Harkerville Saturday Morning Market.
- 3. Keurboom's River Ferries in the Keurboom's Nature Reserve, Plettenberg Bay. Pack your picnic and swimming costumes as this activity in the Garden Route is fun for the whole family, 083 254 3551.
- 4. Plettenberg Bay Game Reserve: Game drives and horse back safaris, excellent game viewing, all in Big 5 territory for about R750.00 per person, 084 449 1275.
- 5. Nature's Valley Beach, super safe area with stunning beach and lagoon, surrounded by the Tsitsikamma forest. Stop at the Nature's Way Farm stall for snacks or a light lunch.













- 6. Knysna Ziplines, an adrenaline-filled experience that has you gliding over the treetops and giving you a spectacular view of the surrounding forest and natural landscapes.
- 7. Market off Main, If you love browsing unique, locally-made items, amazing food and drinks plus a lekker vibe, this hotspot in the middle of Plettenberg Bay town offers anything from pizza and sushi to jewellery and home decor.
- 8. Check out the Art Galleries along Plettenberg Bay's Main Street followed by lunch and fresh pastries at the Le Fournil de Plett Cafe and Bakery. You can even do an E-bike town tour from Eleven on Main Street.
- 9. Emily Moon, treat yourself to a delicious meal with a spectacular view of the Bitou River or Friday night pizzas upstairs in Simon's Bar.
- 10. Explore The Plettenberg Bay Wine Route, one of the smallest wine routes in South Africa but born to stand out. There are 18 wine farms along the route, see our wine guide coming up.

TOP ACTIVITIES FOR KIDS

ADVENTURE LAND: Enjoy the 75m long supertube and a 25m mini supertube for the little ones as well as a kamakazi slide and a 12m high free fall slide – not for the faint hearted. Race down the 2 lane racer or spin around on the raging rapid tube ride. For the toddlers there are 2 little slides that plunge into a kiddles pool, plus a play park with swings and a jungle gym. Spend the day having fun, enjoy the braai area and wide open spaces. Centrally situated along the Garden Route between Plettenberg Bay and Knysna.

THE HEATH: before Plettenberg Bay on the right, huge playground, good coffee, plant nursery, art and there is also a Raptor Rescue Sanctuary.

LEISURE ISLAND: In Knysna, for toddler safe swimming on beautiful Bollard's Bay beach and for walking, picnicking and exploring on the National Park side. Lindy's Table Cafe also has a play area under the trees.

BIRDS OF EDEN and MONKEYLAND: Two Wildlife parks next to each other, Monkeyland Primate Sanctuary is the world's first multi-species, free roaming primate sanctuary with 12 hectares of indigenous forest which is home to over 500 primates of 9 different species. Birds of Eden is the largest single-dome free flight aviary in the world, spanning 2.3 hectares of natural forests, streams and dams with over 200 different species.

THESEN ISLANDS: In Knysna, there's a great playground for kids in between a few nice restaurants for pizza/tapas/burgers etc that also overlook the lagoon.

ICE DREAM LAND: On our Airport Road, a pizza restaurant run by a family originally from Italy, it has great ambiance with relaxed outdoor seating, a big playground and much of what they use they make themselves including cheeses and ice creams, open until 4pm.

OLD NICK VILLAGE: just outside Plettenberg Bay it has shops, studios, and workshops, a playground, restaurant and a working Mill and on Wednesdays there is a market.

5 MUST VISIT WINE FARMS




Packwood Wine and Country Estate

Between Plett and Knysna, a hilltop estate with commanding views of the surrounding landscape: on one side are massive gorges, mountain views and the distant ocean, embraced from the north by indigenous forests. From their small vineyard they produce many wines: cap classique, pinot noir, chardonnay and sauvignon blanc. If you're planning a visit, stay a while and enjoy the fresh air and views across the farm while diving into a farm-fresh lunch of soft delicately flavoured cheese, crusty bread, chutneys and dips.

PLETTENBERG BAY WINE ROUTE MAP

Near the Knysna Elephant Park, this small, sustainability-focused estate has not looked back since garnering a Double Gold award for its third sauvignon blanc harvest. Now, with a fully-fledged café-style restaurant in the pretty gardens overlooking the elephant park, vineyards and dam, its fabulous countryside location has truly come into its own. Along with breakfasts and lunches they do pizza and delectable packed picnics comprising of baked treats and items thoughtfully selected from a seasonal menu. There's a little farm shop selling wines and produce from the area too.



Kay and Monty Vineyards

With sumptuous mountain views this boutique-size farm has just 7.5 hectares under vine, its distinctive sauvignon blanc and popular Champu MCC are more than worthy of a visit (and they recently released their first rosé and red blend). Along with wonderful wines, there are the beautifully prepared artisanal platters served in The Tasting Room.

Newstead

With a focus on organic farming techniques and preference for producing small quantities of high-quality grapes, Newstead's Family Vineyards is authentic and unpretentious. The first MCC produced here was a 2012 blanc de blanc that won a double-gold at the Michaelangelo Awards, the Bubbly Bar is well-stocked and also serves craft beers and gin-infused cocktails. It's worth lingering for the food, too – the restaurant does pizzas as well as dishes put together from what's in season and whatever's fresh from the garden. They also provide picnics that can be enjoyed between the vines.

Bitou Vineyards

With vineyards on former polo fields and a new cellar in the old stable block this estate on the banks of the Bitou River has recently evolved into a robust wine-country destination. Not only are there wonderful sauvignon blancs and a marvellous malbec (that went into oak barrels in 2020) to taste, there's a restaurant doing delicious food in a handsome setting. It opens onto a deck overlooking vineyards and near-distant mountains. There's also a line-up of entertainment events if you're looking for more reasons to settle in for a while.















TOP 10 - KNYSNA

- 1. Brunch at the iconic **East Head Café** followed by the short walk at the Heads view point.
- 2. Explore Steenbok Nature Reserve and Bollards Bay beach on Leisure Island
- 3. Boat trip and hike in the Featherbed Nature Reserve with spectacular panoramic views along the Western Head.
- 4. Picnic / Braai and walk along the stream to the waterfall at Jubilee Creek
- 5. Explore **Belvidere**, the old church and suburb parks, walk along the lagoon side and end up at the **Bell Tavern pub** for a drink/meal.
- 6. Experience the incredible sunset, lagoon and beaches of Goukamma River Mouth and Buffalo Bay.
- 7. Scramble down to the **Drupkelders Rock Pools** and swim upriver between the dramatic cliffs.
- 8. Rent canoes and paddle through the canals of **Thesen Islands**, docking at the main dock for lunch at one of the 4 waterside restaurants.
- 9. Book the private cinema at the **Mount Knysna** to watch a film of your choice. in luxurious leather recliners and a restaurant / cocktail bar with a view upstairs.
- 10. Be blown away by the **Fisherman's Walk**, a beautiful walk along the precipitous cliffs of **Brenton-on-Sea** with stairs down to **The Block**, a small peninsula and private beach with rock pools and caves only accessible at low tide.
